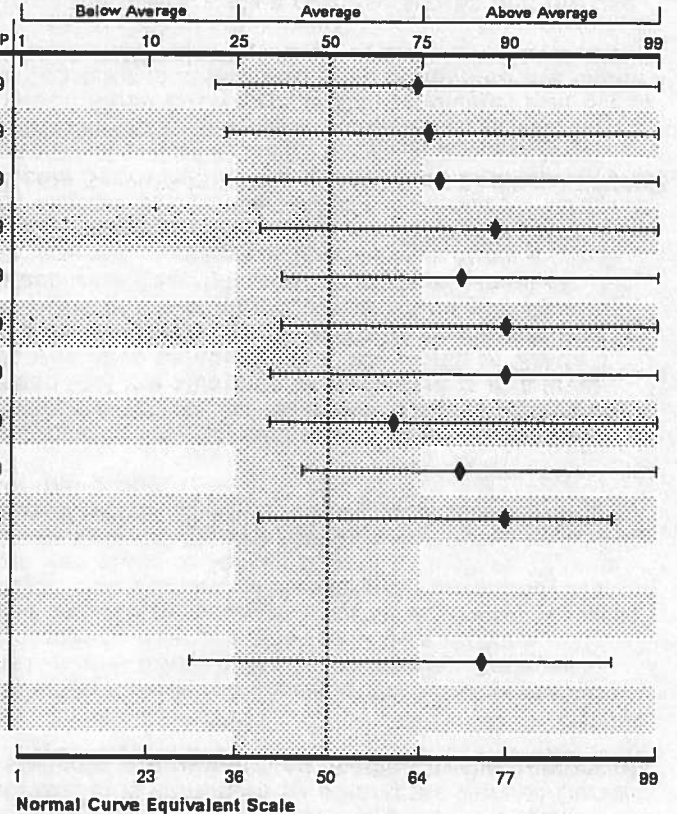

Observations

Displayed on the left are the norm-referenced scores for every content area tested. The Median National Percentile (MDNP) score, and the lowest and highest National Percentile (NP) scores of the group are shown in the last two columns. Displayed on the right is a graph of the MDNP scores. The MDNP is indicated by the diamond. The width of the band running through the diamond represents the range (low to high) of the students' scores. The shaded area on the graph represents the average range of scores, defined as the middle 50 percent of students nationally. Two of the group's eleven MDNP scores are in the average range. Scores in the area to the right of the shading are above the average range.

National Percentile Scale



Scores in the area to the left of the shading are below the average range. Nine MDNP scores are above the average range and no MDNP scores are below the average range. In Reading, for example, the MDNP score is 75.0, which is in the average range. The lowest Reading score in the group is 21 and the highest is 99. (This information is shown both on the graph and in the "Low/High NP" column.)
