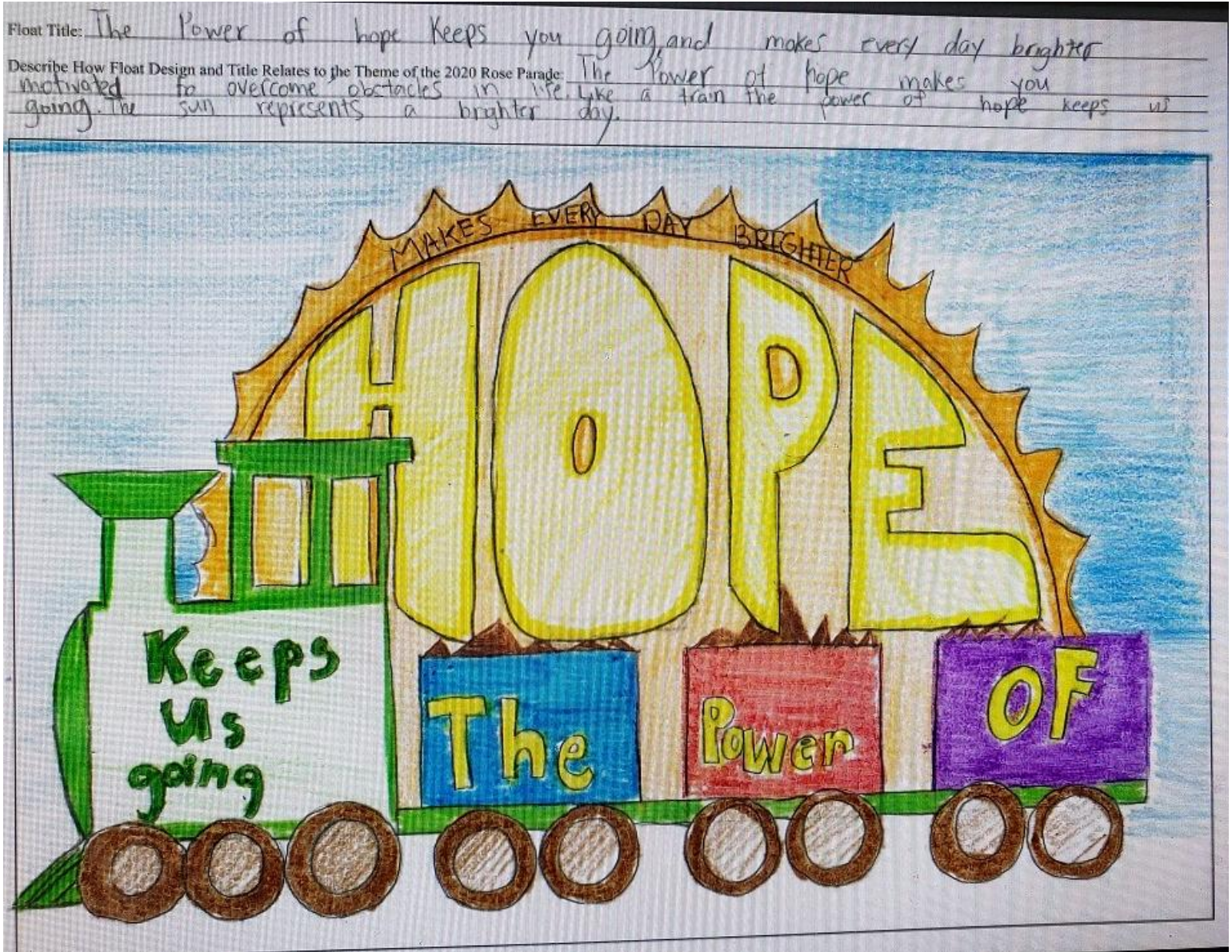
Gonzalez, a 4<sup>th</sup> grade student at Oneonta Montessori School, was one of many local students who submitted artwork for the City’s annual contest.
